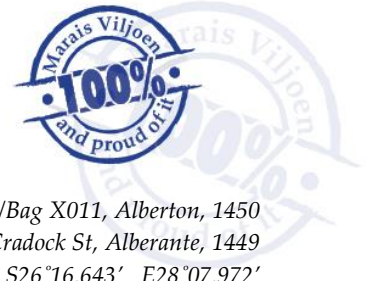

CIRCULAR 8 (2019)

1. WINTER UNIFORM

According to our policy it is compulsory for learners to wear winter uniform from 2 May to 31 August. The winter uniform consists of the following:

- Boys wear slacks, a jersey / pullover, school tie and blazer.
- Girls, when wearing a dress, must wear black tights, long sleeved shirt, blazer and school tie.
- With slacks the girls wear a long sleeved shirt, jersey / pullover, school tie and blazer.
- **A long sleeved jersey may never be worn without a blazer.**

4. CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PARENTS AND SUPPORTERS

GENERAL POLICY

The participation in school sport is primarily educational in nature.

AIM OF SCHOOL SPORT

To encourage participation and to provide learners with sportsmanship, self-discipline, poise and perseverance.

IDENTIFICATION WITH MARAIS VILJOEN

- Parents and spectators must view themselves as representatives of the school whenever they attend matches or support their children.
- You are encouraged to support your child's team and as many as possible of our other school teams.

BEHAVIOUR DURING MATCHES

- Positive support is appreciated.
- Parents and spectators are requested to refrain from making negative comments or using improper language against - or to - the referees, other officials, players or supporters of the opposition.
- Players and spectators must exhibit the necessary tolerance and respect to fellow spectators and the opposition.
- Parents and spectators are requested to maintain the necessary distance from the side lines and not to enter the playing field or demarcated areas. During cricket matches spectators may not sit or move behind the bowler. At hockey matches the spectators may not sit against the goal box or move behind the scoreline.
- Parents and spectators are requested not to pace next to the field while a match is in progress.
- Players and spectators are requested not to enter, where applicable, the technical areas.

- Players and spectators must always behave in a manner that reflects the school's image and do nothing that may damage it.

INJURIES

Players and spectators are requested not to go onto the field when a player is injured. If the coach/manager or first aid personnel deem it necessary, the parents involved will be called.

TEAM

You are requested not to interfere with the coach's decisions about team members. Suggestions offered in the correct spirit may be made to coach at a suitable time.

COMMUNICATION CHANNELS

Players and spectators may take up any enquiries or problems with the head of sport or the principal. Problems may also be discussed with the person concerned, however, not next to the field.

WE EXPECT THE CODE OF CONDUCT TO BE ADHERED TO, TO ENSURE THAT PLAYERS AND SPECTATORS CAN ENJOY THEIR SPORT.

Please take note that all learners making use of school transport, to and from meetings, have to get onto the bus at school and be fetched from school afterwards. No learners may be picked up or dropped off somewhere along the way.

5. CODE OF CONDUCT FOR LEARNERS

INTRODUCTION

The aim of this document is to clarify the rights and responsibilities of everyone concerning sport participation.

Everyone is committed to:

- Integrity
- The development of the sport in which you participate
- Sportsmanship and a positive attitude
- Responsibility towards your team members, parents, coaches and sponsors

RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Everyone has the right to enjoy sport in a safe and properly structured environment.

- The prescribed age groups must be adhered to at all times to protect a player against injuries and the influence of older learners.
- The highest form of sportsmanship must be maintained at all times.
- The correct sporting wear and equipment are very important.
- Players must treat their own, and the school's equipment, with respect and maintain it (look after it).
- Players must accept responsibility for their actions and must adhere to the rules of every sport.
- Everyone has the right to be treated courteously as well as the responsibility to be worthy of it. Players must commit themselves to be responsible and civil to showcase the values and standards of Marais Viljoen.
- Impeccable behaviour and language are expected at all times.
- No fellow player, official, opposition or spectator may be insulted.
- Everyone must exhibit tolerance and respect to members of the opposite gender as well as to other language- and cultural groups.
- Everyone must ensure that he/she possesses the necessary knowledge of the rules and the interpretation thereof.
- Life values such as problem solving, courage, daring, respect, pride and humility must be cultivated.

Rules and discipline concerning matches hosted by Marais Viljoen or those that are our players participate at.

- Players are subject to the rules of the school from the moment they depart from home until their return.
- It is expected of the players to always be a good example.
- Players must always be dressed in the correct sporting wear during meetings where it is called for.
- Learners must be dressed in uniform both before and after their matches.
- Players must always practise the sport to the best of their abilities and with the necessary sportsmanship.
- Players must always accept the rulings of the referees with the necessary respect.
- Players must always be irreproachable ambassadors for Marais Viljoen through their actions and appearance.
